

Penns Grove Sewerage Authority

The regular monthly meeting of the Penns Grove Sewerage Authority was called to order by our Chairman, Mr. Morris, at 5:00 P.M. on November, 19 2020 in accordance with Public Law 1075, Chapter 231. Notice of this meeting was advertised in the South Jersey Times and on the website.

Present at the meeting were: Mr. Morris, John Scarpaci, Carl Washington, Cliff Poindexter and by phone Mary Kay James.

Mr. Morris made a motion to accept the Resolution 2020-11-1, cancelling sewer charges for 105 N. Broad which was foreclosed on by The Borough of Penns Grove. Was approved by John Scarpaci and second by Carl Washington.

Mr. Morris made a motion to accept the Resolution 2020-11-2, cancelling sewer charges for 186 S. Broad which was foreclosed on by The Borough of Penns Grove. Was approved by John Scarpaci and second by Carl Washington.

Marie Danks stated that 51-53 W. Pitman and 78 N. Broad where capped off. Also gave copy of information about Executive order 190.

NJUAJIF dividend will be credited, \$2,955.00, to next bill.

Mr. Boden stated the roof project is just about finished.

Mr. Boden stated the boiler inspection all went well.

Mr. Boden stated the EJIF inspection scored 99 out of 100. No new recommendations.

Mr. Boden stated that we will be adding Dissolve Oxygen to our existing Laboratory Certification due to Vineland Environmental no longer performing parameter. Had to purchase new meter for \$1700.00 plus \$400.00 for addition to permit. Will make up this cost within first year (cost approx. \$50.00 per week).

Mr. Boden stated that the VFD Raw Pump #1 failed, Plale will be replacing.

Mr. Boden stated that the Jet truck had to go out for emergency repairs to pump. The pump needed a total rebuild, \$4000.00, should be noted this is the first rebuild to the pump and we have had it since 1996.

Mr. Boden stated that the raw pump rebuild will be next item taken care of.

Mr. Boden stated that the estimated for Collection Cleaning is \$2350.00 and Reliable Environmental Services is the lowest. Should be able to get 12-13 days split into 2 projects. Which will keep up under the 30K allocated for this part of the projects.

Mr. Boden stated that he is still evaluating the generator situation.

Mr. Morris made a motion to pay the bills and was approved by Mr. Poindexter and was seconded by Mr. Washington.

Mr. Morris made a motion to adjourn meeting and was approved by Mr. Poindexter and seconded by Mr. Washington.
